Meeting funds to support participation by US under-represented minority graduate and undergraduate students are available through a grant from USDA-NIFA. The USDA-NIFA definition of under-represented minority is "any ethnic group – African American, Alaskan Native, American Indian, Asian American, Hispanic American, Native Hawaiian, or any other group – whose representation among food, agriculture, and natural resource science professionals is disproportionately less than their proportion in the general population as indicated in standard statistical references."

The National Association of Plant Breeders strengthens plant breeding to promote food security, quality of life, and a sustainable future. The NAPB works to help create a future in which 1) Strong public and private sectors work independently and together to deliver varieties and improved germplasm to society, 2) The value and importance of plant breeding to food security, quality of life, and a sustainable future are known and appreciated by the public, and 3) Plant breeding is viewed as dynamic, problem solving, and creative. The NAPB intends to become a recognized and valued advocate for plant breeding research and education, helping to guide and implement a cohesive national plant breeding agenda.
